This is the Machu Picchu of the north, but 3 times larger and at least 600 years older! It is still a relatively well-kept national secret. This cloud city was created by the Chachapoyas culture. It is an archeological wonder, and extremely unique compared to other building structures of the Americas.  To arrive we will take a gorgeous 20-minute gondola ride (4 km) and small hike to finally reach this sacred site perched on top of the mountain at ~3000 meters above sea level. You will awaken in the scenic jungle of the Amazonas department—a close grasp away from the stunning waterfall Gocta, the 3rd tallest free-leaping waterfall in the world. A sacred site were ancient cultures performed rituals and bathed in its crashing waters.  After an early breakfast, all who wish to immerse themselves in nature and bathe in the falls, can join a guided group on a scenic trail to the falls. It will be an early departure (~830 am), and the trail is about ~2 hrs. If you wish, horses are available for the trail ride (added cost). After some time in the falls, we will head back around 11:30 am to have lunch in Gocta around 1:30 pm.  After lunch we will depart for a drive to Bagua (~2 hrs). You'll have a tour of the festival with Aurelio Loret De Mola – an International Awards Chocolate judge (for 6+ years), introducing you to many of the events' presenters, cacao producers/co-ops, and chocolate makers.  You'll get to see all the different cacaos from different regions (fresh), and all the ingenious ways they are processed into amazing chocolate, but also syrups, wine, liqueurs, pulp sugars, and much more.
